#### REGISTRATION

A non-refundable registration fee of \$200 per person is required and due at the time you register. This will be deducted from your total tour fare, the balance of which will be due on July 16, 2010. Securing or updating a passport is your responsibility and you may take care of the required visa yourself. However, if you wish Citslinc to handle the visa application, you will need to provide us with your passport, a signed visa application form, two additional passport photos and a check for \$145 made payable to Citslinc, International. We will return your passport to you in a timely manner.

You are responsible for getting to and from the Los Angeles airport. A single room in all hotels will cost an additional \$450 and an upgrade to business class on the round trip flight is \$4,500. A non-refundable registration fee of \$200 per person is required and due at the time you register. This will be deducted from your total tour fare, the balance of which will be due before July 16, 2010.

**DAY 1: LOS ANGELES/BEIJING- 10/15/10**

Depart from Los Angeles at 12:30 p.m. to Beijing. Your adventure begins as you fly trans-Pacific aboard a wide cabin jetliner. You will cross the International Dateline.

**DAY 2: BEIJING- 10/16/10**

After a short stop over in Shanghai, arrive in Beijing, the Capital of China at 11 p.m. You will be met by your local tour guide at the airport and then check into hotel.

**DAY 3: BEIJING- 10/17/10**

Visit Tian An Men Square, the largest square in the world and the Temple of Heaven, built in 1420 A.D. where the emperors prayed to the heaven for a good harvest. Sightseeing also includes the Palace Museum, also known as the Forbidden City, home of 24 emperors with a total space of 9,999 rooms, and the Summer Palace, known for the Long Corridor with painted gallery, Kunming Lake and Longevity Hill, Seventeen-Arch Bridge and Marble Boat.

**DAY 4: BEIJING- 10/18/10**

Tour bus expedition to the Great Wall, the 4,000 mile long and 2,000 year old construction is said to be the only man-made structure visible by the naked eye from the moon. Visit the Ming Tombs, one of 13 Ming Emperors' Tombs is fully excavated and open for exploration. Roasted Beijing Duck Dinner

**DAY 5: BEIJING/SHANGHAI/SUZHOU- 10/19/10**

Morning flight to Shanghai, then tour bus trip to Suzhuo often called the Capital of silk or World of Garden. Afternoon sightseeing to Lingering Garden, Tiger Hill, Hanshan Temple. Visit the National Embroidery Institute to see silk embroidery, an important local craft with 1,000 years of history. Evening dinner show of traditional Chinese music.

**DAY 6: SUZHOU/HANGZHOU- 10/20/10**

Morning bus to Hangzhou to visit Economic Development Zone. Visit centuries old Lingyin Temple where you will see the 64-foot Buddha carved from camphor wood.

**DAY 7: HANGZHOU/SHANGHAI- 10/21/10**

Morning boat cruise on West Lake with relaxing stopover at jewel-like pagodas and tea houses. Afternoon tour bus to Shanghai.

**DAY 8: SHANGHAI- 10/22/10**

Sightseeing includes the Yu Garden, a maze of marvelous pavilions, ponds, rocks and over arching trees. Visit to the Bund, a famous waterfront park. Business visit to the Pudong economic development zone. (World Expo option).

**DAY 9: SHANGHAI/LOS ANGELES- 10/23/10**
